November cookies

Ingredients

1. 150g butter ,softened
2. 50g caster sugar
3. 100g light brown sugar
4. 1 tsp vanilla extract
5. 1 large egg
6. 250g plain flour
7. ¼ tsp baking powder
8. 100g milk or dark chocolate chips
9. 60g dark chocolate melted
10. 60g dark royal icing sugar mixed
With 2 tsp water
11. 20 maltesers
12. 5 cream-filled chocolate sandwich
cookies
13. 5 carmel-filled chocolates.

Recipe

Step 1. Heat the oven to 180c /160cfan /gas 4, and line two baking sheets with baking parchment .Beat the butter and sugar together with an eclectic whisk until light and fluffy. Add egg and beat again to combine. Stir in the flour and baking powder with a wooden spoon until you have a stiff dough then fold in the chocolate chips.

Step 2. Divide the dough into 20 pieces and roll into balls. Arrange on the prepared baking sheets well spaced out so there's space for spreading [you may need to bake them in batches]. Press The tops of the cookies down very slightly using the palm of your hand or the bottom of a glass . bake the cookies for 10-12 mins until golden around the edges then leave to cool on the baking sheets for 10 mins transfer to wire cracks and leave to cool completely.

Step 3. to make the spider cookies .lay 10 of the cooled cookies out in front of you .spoon the melted chocolate into a piping bag and the royal icing into another piping bag and the royal icing into another then snip off the ends using scissors .pipe a dot of royal icing onto the back of two maltesers, and arrange these onto one of the cookies to create the head and body repeat with the remaining nine cookies and the rest of the maltesers .pipe eight spiders legs around the bodies of the spider using the chocolate. Pipe two small dots of royal icing onto the heads to create eyes ,then pipe very small dots of chocolate over the eyes to create pupils. If you like decorate the bodies with the royal icing

Step 4. To make the bat cookies ,lay the remaining ,10 cookies out in front of you separate the cream-filled chocolate sandwich ,and cookies ,and careful scrape the cream filling of the chocolate cookie pieces .cut the chocolate cookie pieces into semicircles using a small serrated knife ,stick a carmel -filled chocolate onto the middle of each cooled cookie using the royal icing then use a little more to stick a chocolate cookie semicircle on either side of the chocolates to make the bat wings .pipe eyes onto the chocolates to make the bat wings ,pipe eyes onto the chocolates using the royal icing and melted chocolate.

Origami

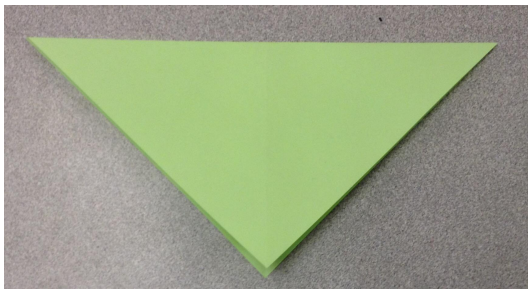
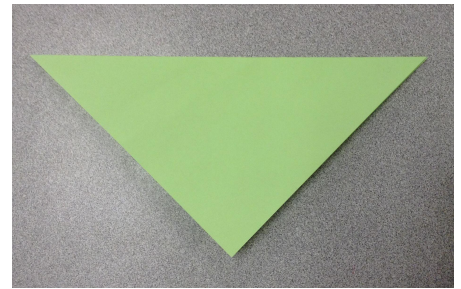
Hi! We are here to teach you how to make an origami fortune teller. Just scroll down and follow the steps.



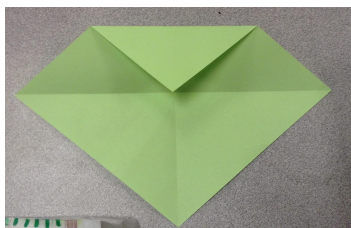
1 = So, if you do not have origami paper just do this trick. :)



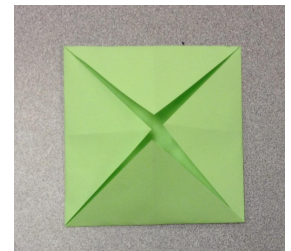
2 = Ok now you take your paper and fold it into a triangle, and then unfold the paper.



3 = Take your paper and fold it the other way into a triangle then unfold the paper.

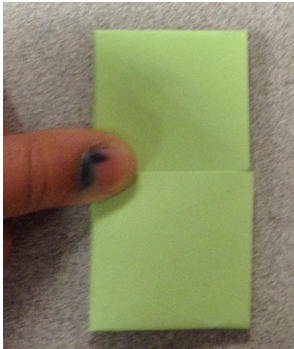
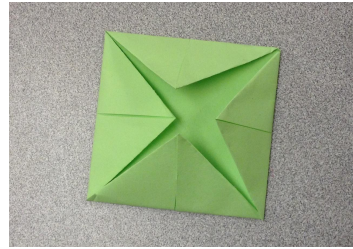


4 = Next take your paper and fold the corners into the center of the paper. Do this to all of the corners then flip the paper over.

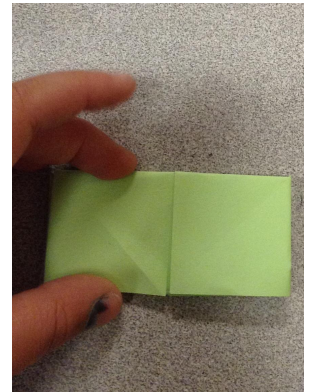

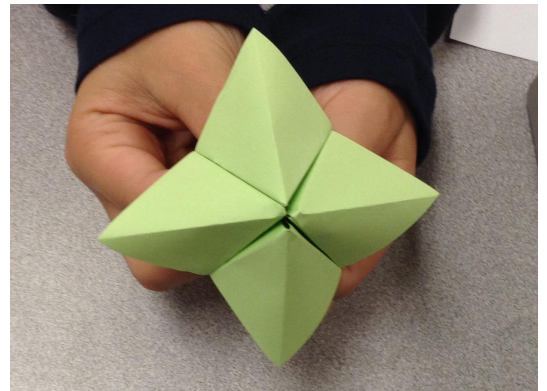
5 = Next fold all of the corners into the center on the back of the paper.
